

8-Ball Scorekeeping: Learn the Language

Everyone on your team can quickly and easily learn how to keep proper score! Use these diagrams to help explain how to properly mark your scoresheet and gain insight as to where items need to be marked.

Shows that this is the second week of play and the session is 12 weeks.

Shows the date this match is scheduled to play.

This scoresheet is for Division 043 Team 6.

Fill in the actual match start time and end time.

If you have questions, the Team Captain will need to contact the Division Rep.

This player's Membership Number.

This player's Matches Played for this session.

This player owes money to the League Office.

Player made an Early 8 (E-8, 8OT). Mark Scratch on 8 (S-8).

An inning is not over, therefore, not marked until the player who lost the initial lag misses or otherwise completes his/her turn.

Defensive Shots: All intentionally missed shots must be recorded. By conscientiously marking intentionally missed shots, you are helping to insure the accuracy of the skill levels of the other players in your division.

A T is marked in the game box when the player takes a time out. In the first game, the player listed first in this match had a time out. In the second game of the match, both players had a time out. Indicates table size.

Shows Amount Due

Shows Player has not paid membership

This shows that Team 6 did not have a 5th player and they forfeited the fifth match to Team 1. Both teams will pay weekly League fees.
