





Pool tournaments come and go, but securing the title of U.S. Amateur Champion is something you carry with you forever, literally, when your name is forever added to the Trophy of Champions for generations to come.

That's what drove more than 2,100 of North America's top amateur players to try and qualify for the 26th Annual event. That's what brought 128 men and 42 women to Stroker's in Palm Harbor, Fla., in early November to compete in the 2019 U.S. Amateur Championship.

Of course, there are worse places to be than the sun-soaked skies of the Tampa area, one of the premier vacation destinations in the world, at a time when most of the country is getting its first taste of winter.

Winners of each division also receive an all-expenses paid trip to a pro event courtesy of APA.

And, of course, the championship trophy - a combination of marble and bronze that more closely resembles a piece of art than something won in a pool tournament.

Baker Wins Title in First Appearance

Over the first quarter-century of the U.S. Amateur Championship, the event, in many ways, came to be defined by a list of seasoned veterans, who, year after year, left their mark on the event. Certain names you came to expect to see on the qualifier list each year, names like Brisbon, Brodt and Parks.

Now in its 26th year, a youth movement seems to have taken hold at the U.S. Amateur Championship, with a new crop of young amateur players looking to leave their mark on the event and the sport, much like their predecessors.

It began in 2018, when a previously unknown 26-year-old from Peoria, Ill., named Abe Schaad took home the title. This year, it was another 24-year-old newcomer making his mark after being inspired by the defending champion.

Blake Baker of Las Vegas went undefeated in his first U.S. Amateur Championship appearance and secured his place in amateur pool history.

Baker defeated 65-year-old **Bobby** Stovall of Cumming, Ga., 11-5 in the championship match.

Baker controlled the finale from the getgo, taking a 4-0 lead in the 9-Ball set before Stovall finally got on the board. The players traded wins the next two games, making it a 5-2 match. Baker would win five of the final six games in the 9-Ball set and held a commanding 10-3 lead as the players began the 8-Ball set with the newcomer on-the-hill needing one final game.

Stovall managed to stave off elimination in the first two games of the 8-Ball set,

making the score 10-5, but Baker's bid for the title would not be denied. In the sixteenth and final game, he pocketed the 8-ball and the win.

Baker will move on to compete in a 2020 pro event courtesy of APA, and more importantly, his name will be added to the Larry Hubbart Trophy.

Stovall finishes as the Runner-up, his highest finish in the U.S. Amateur Championship.

Defending champion Abe Schaad finished in 3rd, dropping matches to only Baker and Stovall in the process.

One hundred and twenty-eight players competed in this year's U.S. Amateur Championship.

Larsen Wins Record Third Womens U.S. Amateur Championship

Tina Larsen of Westville, Ind., defeated Nathalie Jacob of Montreal, Quebec in a seesaw battle by a score of 9-7. The victory earned Larsen her third Womens U.S. Amateur Championship victory, and her first since 2007. She surpassed Tammie Jones and Amy Chen, both two-time champions, for most Womens U.S. Amateur Championship career titles.

Before securing her third title, Larsen had to go through a strong newcomer in Jacob, who's previous playing career consisted primarily of 9-Ball, with little experience playing 8-Ball. Despite her lack of proficiency in 8-Ball, Jacob gave Larsen all she could handle in the final.

Jacob got on the board first in the 9-Ball set, with Larsen taking the next two games and a 2-1 lead. Jacob took the next rack, before Larsen secured the next two, one by way of a 9-on-the snap. With Larsen leading 4-2, Jacob showed some fight, battling back to win the next two games and even the

match at 4-4. Larsen regained the lead, before Jacob again evened things up at 5-5. Larsen took the final game of 9-Ball as the match moved to the 8-Ball set.

Larsen took the first game of the 8-Ball set and the players traded wins over the next three games. In the sixteenth game of the match, the ladies engaged in a showdown of defensive shots. It was here that Jacob's lack of experience in 8-Ball hindered her, as Larsen won the safety battle and eventually the match, 9-7.

Jacob finished as the Runner-Up, the highest finish ever for a Canadian in the Womens U.S. Amateur Championship.

Stacie Bourbeau of Orange, Mass., finished in 3rd Place.



League Operator Spotlight Ashley & Kevin Morgan - Lake & Osceola Counties Florida



How long were you APA members before deciding to become League Operators?

Ashley: We played in the APA for 26 years between us; me for 8 and Kevin for 18. I won more Vegas trips than Kevin though, 3 trips to 1! Kevin captained multiple teams and was very familiar with League structure. I was the player who played APA for the social aspects before becoming a League Operator. I didn't even know there were three sessions in a pool year or where my team was in the division standings most sessions.

What made you decide to look into becoming League Operators?

Kevin: Through the years we had many conversations that started with "Wouldn't it be cool if...". Then, in 2018, we went to lunch with our team after losing at World Qualifiers, and a friend who recently franchised an area in North Florida overheard the current League Operator talking about wanting to sell. When we heard this, we immediately packed up our food and went back to the pool hall to talk to the League Operator about buying.

The thought of running a low overhead cash business that involved pool, working from home, running fun events, and sleeping in seemed too good to be true. The sleeping in hasn't happened yet, but someday.

Was the process of becoming a League Operator difficult?

Kevin: Difficult isn't the right word, but it was tedious and a little scary. We took over an area that needed some TLC and knew we were going to have to work hard to prove ourselves to the players. The scariest part was the financial investment. It was a big investment for us.

Ashley: I was going to have to quit my job and Kevin was going to have to dip into his retirement. We almost backed out. However, everyone at the home office gave us the confidence and tools we needed to build a good foundation for our League. And the network of League Operators is an amazing resource.

Briefly describe life as League Operators.

Ashley: As an "okay" player, I was not used to walking into a pool hall where players knew me, let alone asked for recommendations on pool equipment. As the League Operator, I was suddenly the most popular person in the room, which was fun but a little overwhelming at first.

Kevin: We work more hours now than we ever have. We get up early to process scoresheets, update social media, organize events, and respond to our players. When most are heading home from work, Ashley and I are heading out to League night to start the second half of our day. We do almost everything ourselves but have recently brought on some help.

It's a fun job, but it's demanding, and if you're trying to grow your League, you're out there every night.

What do you most enjoy about being a League Operator?

Ashley: Running tournaments is great, but hearing stories of how players help each other out has to be the best part. We love hearing that someone got a job from meeting someone at League night or how a new friendship started between teammates. I can count on one hand a few stories that brought me to tears; lifesaving relationships that were developed because we approached someone at a bar and asked them if they wanted to play pool.

Kevin: Bringing APA to new Host Locations is great too. Forming those business relationships with bar owners and waitstaff, the excitement they have to host APA, it's another great feeling. It's amazing to have a job that can have this kind of impact on our community and the people in it.

What advice would you give to someone considering becoming a League Operator?

Kevin: Go into it with a willingness to work every day. Although you may know APA as a player, you will learn a new side of things, so just be open to the changes coming your way. Talk to your fellow League Operators and the APA staff. Don't be afraid to ask for ideas and advice! That's what APA is about.





9-Ball Scorekeeping

This sample diagram describes the information printed on scoresheets and illustrates how to properly score your match. Inaccurate scorekeeping affects the entire League, so keep play fun and fair! Remember to accurately mark Defensive Shots for your team and your opponent.



Keep track of any balls not credited to either player. You should account for these balls to avoid confusion.

Balls 1 through 8 count as one point each.

4 8

The 9-ball counts as two points.

The sample scoresheet above shows that player two, who is a SL3 lost the match. To award the match points earned, we need to look for his skill level on the Score of Match chart. The area circled above shows that if a SL3 lost and his score for the match was 21, the match points are 13-7. You will record 7 points for player two and 13 points for player one.

After the 6th game player one had 37 points. In the 7th game we see that he broke the rack and made the 9-ball on the break, which gave him 39 points and the match. Player one is a SL5 and his highest possible points are 38. In the total points block you will record 38.

A Defensive Shot must be marked for a player on any shot where there is no INTENT to legally pocket a ball of his category. At the end of the match, total and circle the number of Defensive Shots for each player. If there are no Defensive Shots by a player write "No DS" in the block.

Improving Your Game with Bruce Barthelette



Bruce Barthelette, "The Big Guy", is a professional poolplayer, and one of the top 10 trick shot players in the world. He has appeared on ESPN over 10 times, including the most recent World Cup of Trickshots tournament. He has played with Jeanette Lee, aka "The Black Widow", Mike Massey, Andy Segal, and Tom Rossman, among other top professionals in the game. He also played with Ewa Laurance and Allison Fisher, two members of the BCA Billiard Hall of Fame.

Bruce, along with his wife Ann, has run the second largest APA Pool League for over 20 years. With more than 6,000 players in the League, the APA of Connecticut is second only to Maryland.

TIPS & STRATEGIES

Strategies depend on whether you are a lower or higher-skilled player.

Many beginning players and lower-skilled players enjoy 9-Ball because they already know which ball to shoot at. Much of the decision making used in 8-Ball is reduced. Instead, decide whether you should play offense or defense. 9-Ball is a good game to improve your shot making, positioning, and kicking ability and to expand your thought process and defensive play.

Many lower-skilled players face difficult shots after pocketing a ball. Having to shoot difficult shots is one way to increase your shot-making ability. Most often you will concentrate on making your shots. If you are not confident in making a ball, consider a safety. Beginning players should focus more on making one ball at a time.

Two-way shots are a good option when you are not sure of a shot and are unable to identify a good safety. In case you miss, you will earn yourself another chance back at the table or ball-in-hand.

Higher-skilled players are more likely to position themselves better to run a table. Again, you want to take higher percentage shots. If you get out of position, consider locking up balls or hiding them when you have a difficult table to run. Changing the table layout will give you a better opportunity to get back to the table. More advanced players focus on finding three-ball patterns and getting a good leave on their next shot.

Intentional fouls come in handy when you are unsure you can make a good hit. Pass the table back to your opponent without giving him a shot. Knock an object ball toward the next ball in sequence or another ball to create a cluster and stop a run. Doing this is also a good option when your opponent can't get a breakout.

Offense Strategies for Lower Skill Levels



- Try to shoot the balls that you are capable of making. If you are unsure of a shot, look for a safe.
- In league play every ball counts, so you want to run as many as you can.
- Pay attention to the cue ball. The more you move it around, the better your chances of scratching.
- Use center ball hits on the cue ball as much as possible. Putting english on the cue ball will make the shot more difficult.

Offense Strategies for Higher Skill Levels



- When you are good at banking and are faced with this situation, you should go for the shot.
- Shoot into the 1-ball to bank it into the corner pocket.
- Your cue ball will come back toward the center of the table leaving you with a good shot on the
- You should give yourself a slight angle so you can position the cue ball fairly straight on the 3-ball to roll it up into the corner.

Defense Strategies for Lower Skill Levels



- You have two options here.
- Offensively, you could go for the 1-ball in the corner and bring the cue ball back across for the 2.
- Defensively, shoot directly into the 1-ball just hard enough to get it to the rail and a little farther.
- Your cue ball will land in the middle of the table, and the 1-ball will land near the center of the back rail.

Defense Strategies for Higher Skill Levels




- When you are weaker at banking and faced with this situation, consider playing smart.
- With the same idea as when you choose offense, execute a two-way shot.
- Hit the 1-ball full as though you are banking it.
 Execute with a stop shot to sit the cue ball behind the 8.
- If you miss the bank, you will increase your chance to get ball-in-hand. You will still have a shot at the 2 if you make it.


Trick and Fancy Shot #3

DEGREE OF DIFFICULTY: 6.0

CUE BALL(S) PLACEMENT: In hand (within 1-ball's width of pocket "E") – frozen to 1-ball and 2-ball.

OBJECT BALL(S) PLACEMENT: 4-ball on foot spot, 3-ball frozen to 4-ball, 1-ball and 2-ball frozen to cue ball as diagram indicates.

OBJECTIVE: Shoot cue ball into 1-ball and 2-ball. Then, cue ball will contact 3-ball. Make 4 object balls as pocket letters designate.




Trick and Fancy Shot #4A

DEGREE OF 7.0

CUE BALL(S) PLACEMENT: Centered on head spot of table.

OBJECT BALL(S) PLACEMENT: 1-ball frozen to foot cushion and centered at one diamond from pocket "C".

OBJECTIVE: Shoot cue ball to 1-ball and make 1-ball as pocket letter designates.


